
Objectives:

Outcome: strengthen the capacities of ASEAN countries in contributing to Codex standards-setting and implementing the adopted Codex standards

Activities in 2017 - 2018

- Organize Regional, National training courses to strengthen effective participation in Codex activities:
 - regional training workshop, in Bangkok (January 2017)
 - national training workshops in the Philippines (September 2017)
 Viet Nam (November 2017) and Lao PDRs (March 2018)
- Develop the training manual of "Enhancing Effective Participation in Codex activities"
- Develop the Manual of the Role, Responsibilities and Working Procedures for functioning of the Codex Contact Point of Myanmar"
- ➤ Jointly-organize the FAO/OIE/WHO meeting to accelerate prevention and control of neglected foodborne parasitic zoonoses in selected Asian countries (Lao PDR, Oct 2018)
