

Status of Countries and Regions Introduced Import Restrictions on Japanese Foods after the Nuclear Accident

- ✓ Total 54 countries and regions have introduced import restrictions on Japanese food following the nuclear accident, and more than half of them, 32 have eliminated the restrictions.
