

G10 Ministerial Communiqué¹

1. G10 Ministers noted with regret that convergence among the United States, the European Union, Brazil and India, the so called “G4”, was not possible at this stage and that the G4 could not contribute positively to the multilateral process.
2. G10 Ministers remain convinced that the multilateral process in Geneva needs to be intensified to allow for a successful conclusion of the Doha Round.
3. G10 Ministers also reaffirmed their commitment to contribute positively to the multilateral process. The G10 will provide inputs, as we have ever demonstrated², and cooperate closely with the Chairs of the Negotiating Groups to assist them in producing the necessary papers to pursue work in a transparent and inclusive manner.
4. Contributions from all Members are needed to reach a balanced outcome acceptable to all participants. All sensitivities have to be taken into account, as well as various levels of development in line with the development dimension of the DDA.
5. G10 Ministers stressed the need for overall balance across all areas of the “Single Undertaking”. Therefore, parallel progress is necessary in all areas of the negotiations, including NAMA, Services and Rules.
