Therefore, the Japanese government has submitted its opinion that there should not be any more trade- restrictive measures than necessary.  In November 2020, the revised draft was notified under the TBT Agreement, and the scope of products subject to the above requirements was changed from all foods to specific foods. However, MAFF pointed out that the scope has been extensively designated without any scientific grounds and others, and an opinion that it should be reconsidered was submitted.  In September 2021, a new letter was sent from GACC requesting that manufacturers that produce items that are already being traded register in advance, by October 31. In response to that, we submitted a provisional list. From November, GACC started test operations of a system in which manufacturers can register themselves.  On January 1, 2022, the regulation came into effect, and the list of manufacturers registered on the website of the Chinese government was published. Regarding the operation of this regulation, Japan makes an offer in cooperation with relevant WTO Members so that it will not be an unreasonable measure.	In terms of facilities registered on the company list of the Chinese government, additional materials will be submitted to China by the end of June 2023.
