Test report requirement on some products from 9 prefectures changed to certificate of signature of Chamber of Commerce and Industries. Lifted test report requirement on products from 2 prefectures.
Nov 2019	EU*	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Lifted test certificate requirement for some products from some prefectures (including soybeans from Fukushima prefecture and fishery products from 6 prefectures).
Jan 2021	Hong Kong	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Ceased the border test against every consignment of imported Japanese food except for all vegetables, fruits, milk, milk beverages, dried milk, meat, poultry eggs, and fishery products from Fukushima, Ibaraki, Tochigi, Gunma and Chiba.
Mar 2021	French Polynesia	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Lifted certificate requirement for 1) products imported from Japan via third countries, 2) fish and fishery products imported for use as fishing bait.
