**Subject: Emergency Measures for *Chrysanthemum indicum* for planting**

To whom it may concern,

This is to notify you of the emergency measures in Japan for new host plants of *Tomato brown rugose fruit virus* (ToBRFV) from All regions/ countries.

**The emergency measures for *Chrysanthemum indicum***

**1. Plants subject to the measures**

Live plants and plant parts for planting (excluding seeds and fruits) of the following plants:  
*Chrysanthemum indicum* (syn. *Dendranthema indicum*)

**2. Details of the measures**

A laboratory test will be conducted before export, and an additional declaration will be included on the phytosanitary certificate stating that *Chrysanthemum indicum* is free from ToBRFV infection.

This measure will enter into force on February 12, 2026.

A 30-day grace period will be established, during which the following measures will apply to the plants accompanied by a phytosanitary certificate issued before March 13, 2026 that does not include an additional declaration concerning this virus.

If symptoms are found during import inspection by the plant protection station, a laboratory test will be conducted.

The plants accompanied by a phytosanitary certificate issued after March 14, 2026 that does not include an additional declaration concerning this virus must be disposed of.
